Those of you who have lived in Lake Flower and/or Algonquin during the last three years are well aware of how the pandemic impacted our daily administration, operations and maintenance. With the essential services we provide, it's been imperative that a minimum number of staff be healthy at all times. With a conservative approach and small steps, we have made it this far. I am confident we'll continue our forward momentum.

With daily life returning to what resembles normal, procedures that we or others have waived have been, or will soon be, reinstated. Certainly, the courts have reopened and evictions are occurring. We have evicted residents from both the Lake Flower and Algonquin apartments. To be clear, we do not want to evict residents – the residents lose their home and may not have new home; the Housing Authority has an empty unit that requires time and money to make ready for new residents. We strive to work with residents who are in jeopardy of having their leases terminated. With that noted: if rent is not being paid and no efforts are being made to work with the Housing Authority; if recertification requirements are not being complied with; if behaviors are disturbing others' peaceful enjoyment of their homes, we will terminate and, if necessary, evict. A procedure that will be reinstated soon is the assessment of late charges if rent is paid after the fifth of the month.

With March, minds begin to turn to spring. Looking back, though, I hope everyone enjoyed Winter Carnival. The weather could not have been better for the parade. Ideas for next year's theme?

INTERESTED IN HOUSING ASSISTANCE?

If you are not currently living in the Lake Flower high rise or Algonquin Apartments, and you are not currently participating in the Housing Choice Voucher program, don't be shy!

If you are interested in assistance, you should start the process of determining your eligibility. You can go onto our website to print out an application and either drop it off at the office or in the mail. you can also call us and have us mail you an application or stop by to pick up an application. See contact information on last page.

You must be at least 18 years old, and a United States citizen or a non-citizen who has eligible immigration status. Single persons are eligible, as well as households with or without children. HUD commonly refers to a household as a "family," so don't let that term confuse you. A "family" consists of one or more persons, and having children is not required to be considered a "family."

<u>Algonquin News</u>: Guess what? It's that time of year again when everything that was left in the yard last fall starts popping up as the snow melts. That's where that went, I have been looking all over for that! In addition, if you have pets, well, you know what shows up! Time to get the shovels out and clean up the backyards. Remember, that is part of the pet policy. The Housing Authority and the architectural firm are looking into the parking lot situation. We will keep you updated. The Algonquin apartments had no tenants move-in or move-out during the month of February.

Reminder: Please make sure your rent is paid. If you are having difficulties, please call the office and set up a repayment agreement.



Bed Bug Information

Where should you look?

- •Mattress (piping, sides, underside)
- •Box spring (remove ticking)
- Bed frame
- Linens
- •Furniture seams, pleats, piping, joints
- •Corners and drawers of desks, dressers, etc.
- •Door, window, and baseboard trim
- •Items on the floor
- What should you look for?
- •All life stages: eggs, nymphs, adults
- Skin casts
- •Blood spots

How do you avoid them?

Carefully inspect all used furniture, linens, and clothing before bringing them into your home.

 Wash and dry clothes on hottest setting items can stand. Transport clothes in plastic bags. Do not put clean clothes in bags used to transport dirty clothes. Throw those away!

Vacuum frequently.Remove clutter.

If possible, use a high powered flashlight when looking around your unit. If you find a bed bug, notify staff immediately. Staff and you will work together to prepare for any needed treatment. Don't delay. It's much easier to treat one or two than it is twenty or thirty. Again, successful eradication requires resident involvement and cooperation.

The sooner we know, the lower the cost to you.
